Environmental Co-operation

- Have to work with what we have
 - Existing institutions
 - Better coordination with other actors
 - Existing tools and instruments
 - ◆ European Neighbourhood Policy/Central Asia Strategy
 - ◆ ENPI/DCI/ENRTP
 - Existing initiatives
 - ◆ Cooperate and collaborate!
 - Improve existing initiatives/actions rather than create new ones of our own

Framework for cooperation

- EU External Policy
 - Contractual agreements (Association Agreements, Partnership Agreements)
 - Environment is a key field for cooperation
 - ENP Action Plans (joint priorities)
- Assistance programmes
 - National Programmes
 - Majority of assistance
 - Country strategies and indicative programmes
 - Programmed in line with country priorities
 - Regional Programmes
 - Limited levels of assistance
 - Regional strategies and indicative programmes
 - Global programmes
 - Lowest levels of assistance for a region but allows cross-regional programming
- ENPI for ENP countries
- DCI for Central Asia

Factors to consider

- Country needs to highlight the issue as a priority
 - Lack of priority or lack of awareness?
- Needs outweigh means
 - Clean-up not an option for Commission instruments
 - Awareness raising, demonstration projects, completing inventories etc.
 - Any new support to be welcomed
- What is the legacy of a project?
 - Assistance to reforms (ENP Action Plans)
 - What about polluter pays principle
 - What to do about other similar problems, how do we choose?
 - Nuclear waste, chemical dumps, post-conflict damages, uranium mines

What can be done?

- Include relevant acquis in ENP AAs
 - Waste Framework Directive, EIA etc.
- Transfer know-how
 - ◆ TAIEX (for ENP countries)/twinning
- Policy dialogue
 - Raise awareness (sub-committees, routine contacts)
- Financial assistance
 - ENPI Regional Waste project
 - ◆ ToRs prepared for Kalush area as contribution to overall efforts
 - Possibility of regional waste strategy for a pilot region still to be chosen
